Alex graduated magna cum laude from Harvard College, concentrating in history and winning the Thomas Temple Hoopes Prize. He received his J.D. from Harvard Law School, where he served as the Editor-in-Chief for the *BlackLetter Law Journal*.

Immediately following law school, Alex served as a law clerk to the Honorable Robert H. Henry on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit, where he assisted the court with a range of matters, including the landmark copyright case, *Golan v. Gonzalez*. Following his clerkship with Judge Henry, Alex clerked for the Honorable William G. Young in the U.S. District Court for the District of Massachusetts, where he assisted the court during a sitting with the Federal Circuit and served as the law clerk for multiple patent trials, including the multi-billion dollar *Amgen v. Roche* trial.
